Session 1: NQT Annual Regional Conference

Friday 27 September 2019

9.30am - 3.00pm

Session 2: Music and PE

North Devon: 11 October 2019, Exeter: 8 October 2019

9.30am - 3.30pm

This day will give two substantial workshops around the teaching of Music and PE. Debbie Kent will lead a workshop that will build confidence in teaching music in the Primary classroom as well as giving plenty of practical advice and ideas. Laura Martin, a Primary SLE, will lead a practical workshop on the teaching of PE, with a particular focus on ensuring engagement of all learners.

Session 3: Phonics into Spelling

North Devon: 29 November 2019, Exeter: 28 Nov 2019

9.30am - 3.30pm

A full day's exploration of how phonics is a fundamental skill in the teaching and learning of grammar and spelling. Literacy specialists Anne Harvey and Ossian Pleasance lead the training with plenty of practical examples, advice, ideas and an opportunity to observe high quality practice from EY to Year 6, in an outstanding school setting.

Session 4: Primary Maths workshop

North Devon: 17 January 2020, Exeter: January 2020

9.30am - 3.30pm

A workshop with Dan Polak – Maths Mastery lead teacher and SLE. Dan will lead learning in key areas of mathematics focusing on the progression of mathematics from EY to Year 6. There will be the opportunity to observe practice in an outstanding school setting.

Session 5: Primary Science and Computing

North Devon: 13 March 2020, Exeter: 18 March 2020

9.30am - 3.30pm

Science: half day session with Gail Holmes to develop understanding of the Science curriculum and to clarify the link between teaching, learning and assessment in Science. Computing: half day session delivered by Fred Barber exploring and understanding the computing curriculum with practical ideas that support classroom practice.

Session 6: SEND and Curriculum

North Devon: 24 April 2020, Exeter: April 2020

9.30am - 3.30pm

SEND: half day session delivered by SEND SLEs, Sarah Milne and Rachel Stevens, to develop understanding of SEND through the graduated response framework and quality first teaching.
Curriculum: half day session delivered by Curriculum SLE, Victoria Jones-Whyte, to develop understanding of the importance of the 'intent', 'implementation' and impact of a whole school curriculum.
